Abstract

The collaborators dedicate this issue to Ioan Raşa on the occasion of his 70th birthday. Ioan has made many important contributions to Approximation Theory and beyond. Here I briefly recall some of his experiences with friends and coauthors.

From 1971 to 1976 Ioan studied at Babes-Bolyai University of Cluj-Napoca, graduating with a Master's degree. He received his PhD at the same University in 1982. Meanwhile he started a research activity resulting in several papers, many of them coauthored with several friends from Italy, Germany, Spain, France, Israel, Poland, China, Croatia, Russia, Turkey, India, Romania. Ioan works in Approximation Theory and Functional Analysis (see *F. Altomare, M. Cappelletti Montano, V. Leonessa, I. Rasa, Markov Operators, Positive Semigroups and Approximation Processes, Walter de Gruyter, Berlin, Munich, Boston, 2014*), Ulam Stability (see *J. Brzdek, D. Popa, I. Rasa, B. Xu, Ulam stability of operators, Academic Press, Dordrecht, 2018*) and Inequalities (see, e.g., his recent articles with Ulrich Abel and Dany Leviatan). Some of his conjectures were validated, others still wait for validation.

Ioan visited many Universities, in particular University of Bari (where he spent 2 years working with Francesco Altomare and his school), University of Duisburg-Essen (other 2 years, with Heiner Gonska) and University of Wuppertal (half of year, collaborating with Margareta Heilmann).

Ioan and me started a collaboration in 2010. We published several joint papers, some of them with other coauthors. In 2021 we met Stefano de Marchi and Gianluca Vinti at the 8th European Congress of Mathematics organized in Portoroz. The four of us met also in Sibiu at the International Conference on Approximation Theory and its Applications (ICATA), organized in 2022 and dedicated to Ioan. Step by step we identified topics of joint interest and this already led to some joint papers.

Starting from 1992 Ioan met at Maratea and other conferences the Spanish mathematicians Jesús de la Cal, Francisco Javier Muñoz-Delgado, José Antonio Adell, Daniel Cárdenas-Morales, Antonio-Jesús López-Moreno and their PhD students. Several joint papers resulted from such collaborations. Recently, I joined this team and the collaboration is going on.

Ioan likes to tell jokes and is addicted to literature. His favorite novel is *Il Gattopardo*. One reason is that the main character created by *Giuseppe Tomasi di Lampedusa* is a disguised mathematician illustrating the saying "*Mathematics is simple, mathematicians are complicated*".
